- Set goals and work toward them. Be realistic in the goals that you set and take steps toward reaching those goals.

In summary, self-care means that you seek ways to take better care of yourself. As a caregiver, you don't just survive. You thrive.

#### An introduction to the book of Ruth:

The book of Ruth tells the story of three people: Naomi, a widow from Bethlehem in Judah; Ruth, her daughter-in-law from Moab; and Boaz, a gentleman farmer from Bethlehem. Ruth, in a supreme act of devotion, follows Naomi home from Moab and there meets Boaz, Naomi's close relative. Boaz understands that Ruth, though a foreigner, is a woman of worth. Through a scheme of Naomi to send Ruth to meet Boaz in secret, and through the cleverness of Boaz, who claims Ruth before the city elders, Boaz and Ruth marry and have a child, thus insuring the continuation of the Davidic line that eventually leads to the birth of Jesus.

The other part of our goal is to raise \$4,000 to support Global Health Ministries, which is a Minneapolis based organization that supports health ministries and hospitals around the world, through shipping of medical supplies and supporting infrastructure and training for medical ministries.

# What's going on at Our Savior's Lutheran Church? Ministry & Building Review Updates and More

In October, Our Savior's Lutheran Church participated in a Ministry Review and a Building Review. We are a healthy, stable congregation. In order to build on our strengths and move faithfully into the future, the church council encouraged the completion of these reviews.

The Ministry Review is offered through our synod. The Review included a group from around the synod working with a group from our congregation. Surveys were completed in worship. Conversations were held with community leaders and congregation members. Below is a summary of affirmations and opportunities. You may request a full copy of the report from either of your pastors.

#### Affirmations

- Spirit of welcome, hospitality, laughter, joy, enthusiasm
- Strong support of Synod/ELCA ministry and outreach in community
- Positive and energetic staff
- Ministry opportunities and programming for youth
- Strong choir and musical leadership
- Strong lay leadership. Professionals with experience in many areas.

#### Opportunities

- Provide leadership training and mentoring to engage members more fully into ministry
- Name and celebrate the ministries accomplished through OSLC
- Grow social media presence
- Consider better outside signage
- Expand youth programming with more adult participation
- Provide space for the Community Closet
- Host Community Leader Gatherings

The Building Review is a service provided free of charge by the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. Church Building Consultant, Anne Gerrietts, toured our building and provided recommendations, for our consideration.

Signs – Additional outdoor and better indoor signs are need to welcome and direct visitors.

Kitchen – Our kitchen is a good size.

Relocating the sink island closer to the location of the current island would make the space much more functional.

Offices – For safety of staff and visitors, add small windows in office doors. Similarly, relocate Youth Director office, perhaps by repurposing the chapel space, to be closer to other offices.

Gathering Room – Make this space more welcoming to visitors. Remove a few tables. Add benches or high top tables to stand by. Current set up lends itself to closed exclusive groups, rather than easily providing a space for someone to wander in.

Sanctuary – Remove a couple of back pews, to create easier movement in the back of the sanctuary. Remove pews and add chairs to the overflow space so that the room can be more multi-purpose. Communion rail accessibility.

Main floor chapel – This is an under-utilized space. Relocate chapel (perhaps to current library) and renovate to a more multipurpose space for youth, meetings, etc.

The following items having been identified by the Our Savior's Lutheran Church Property Committee as Major Projects for Consideration:

North Balcony Roof: \$20,000 Quote

Roof removal to deck, add insulation and replace with rubber deck.

Boiler Updates: \$22,000 Quote

Digital boiler controls with auto blow down, Digital controls in Sanctuary & Gathering Room

Family Gathering, Office, Hall Roof Replacements:

Roof removal to deck, add insulation and replace with rubber deck.

Updates to Phone System, WIFI/Internet throughout building, and Security Considerations

Carpet/Paint: Patch walls, hallways and stairwells, repaint, replace carpet in all halls, offices, Gathering Room

Chimes: \$15,000

Install a digital system to replace current system which does not function

Kitchen:

Relocate sink in a work island with storage in center of kitchen, commercial double oven and or burner unit, fridge.

Exterior North & West Window/Building Trim:

Replace window & building trim west of Family Gathering entrance through west entrance.

Sanctuary Roof: \$115,000 Quote

Remove shingles, install 2" insulation and 1" ridge steel on sanctuary roof.

#### What does all of this mean?

Currently, our building is an asset for ministry. Our building can remain an asset for generations to come, if we strategically tend to building maintenance rather than responding only once a problem has occurred. Furthermore, enhancements to our space can make it more hospitable and functional for current and future ministries.

How would we as a congregation like to move forward?

- Perhaps we develop a strategic plan for building needs, and continue to tend to project after project over the course of many years as we have been doing.
- Perhaps we explore a more compete building update, along with a capital campaign, to make this church building a center for mission for the current and future ministries of Our Savior's Lutheran Church.
- Perhaps there are other possibilities
