All of a sudden there is quiet. I peek into a classroom to see what is happening. I observe hands folded and heads bowed. The teacher and students are praying to our heavenly father. Everyone was so focused, calm and at peace. In another room, I observe pure delight as the young ones praise God with singing and using everybody motion possible. Faith was being expressed with joy!

Parents are the first "faith-influencers" of their children. The church provides experiences for children to express their faith with their peers that parents can't always provide. Children benefit from being with other children. They also find out that they can learn about God not just from their parents. They develop relationships with people in their church family one being their Sunday School teacher. Everything that happens in the short hour of Sunday School influences our youth for the rest of the week – and the rest of their lives.

On Transfiguration Sunday, Pr. Emmy and I preached a sermon together in which we talked about where we see God in all of the "wow" moments in our lives – the good, the bad, and everything in between. Pr. Emmy ended that sermon with an excerpt from the book *Dakota: A Spirituality* by Kathleen Norris who reminded us that "hope was stirring at the edges of the day."

As we move closer and closer to Easter and as temperatures slowly warm and spring seems almost a reality, her book again speaks to the realities of the season:

"Mud and new grass push up through melting snow. Lilacs in bud by my front door, bent low by last week's ice storm, begin to rise again in today's cold rain. Thins clouds scatter in a loud wind. Suddenly, fir trees seem like tired old women stooped under winter coats. I want to be light, to cast off impediments, and push like a tulip through a muddy smear of snow. I want to take the rain to heart, let it more like possibility, the idea of change."

Her words read almost like that of the prophet Isaiah, who reminds us that "As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish...so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." (Is. 55:10-11)

Even though we *love* to complain about the snow and rain, perhaps we all need that gentle reminder from Isaiah that it is that snow and rain that water the earth, allowing it to indeed bud and flourish. Our tulips, lilacs, or whatever we grow and tend to do not exist without the snow and rain.

As we wind down the season of Lent, we look forward to that good news of Easter, springing up through the snow like tulips. But just like a plant, the good news of Easter is not the good news without the realities lifted up during Lent and Holy Week. We cannot fully understand the glory of God that we experience on Easter, without first experiencing the journey of God to the cross, and Jesus' eventual persecution and crucifixion.

As Isaiah says the "word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." And that is the story and event that we are squarely experiencing now in this season of Lent, the three great days, and Easter morning. As we hear the stories of the miracles, the doubt, the questions, the friends, the enemies, and everything in between, we remember that it is all part of God's plan for Jesus, and that God's word does not come back empty – it does not end on the cross, just as the ground does not stay frozen and covered in snow and ice. But on Easter morning the stone will be rolled away, death will be defeated, it "will accomplish what God desires and achieve the purpose for which God sent it", and we will all again see the promise of new life in Christ Jesus, just as we see new life spring forth from the earth.

"And the mountains and the hills before you shall burst into song and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands! This will be for the Lord's renown, for an everlasting sign, that will endure forever." (Is. 55:12-13)
