Dear People of Our Savior's Lutheran Church,

I write to you to share some updates about our ministry.

In October 2018, a Ministry Review, conducted by a synod team made up of people from other healthy congregations in the Synod, and Building Review, conducted by an engineering professional, gave us some initial suggestions for opportunities to grow as well as letting us know what they thought we were doing well. This information was shared with the Council, at a forum open to the congregation, and reported at the Annual Congregational Meeting.

At the annual congregation meeting there was a motion to continue our review by having the council establish a Planning Team to offer suggestions on how to better utilize our facilities in a way to promote our current ministries and future needs. This Planning Committee was put together by the Council and the pastors, and comprised of John Hurlimann, LouVay White, Jeff Brown, and Karen Schueneman.

The Planning Committee visited with church committees and other groups who use the building to assess their needs for the present and look to the future while respecting the past. This team continued the process of reviewing our acility needs as a church of many ministries, and submitted a report of their findings and recommendations to the Church Council at its June meeting. A copy of the Planning Team's report is available on the information counter for you to review. The Council has now asked the Property Committee to review the findings, come up with rough estimates of cost to implement the Planning Committee suggestions and have this reported back to the Council by the August meeting.

As a result of the Planning Team's completed review of Our Savior's facilities, the Church Council has recently taken action to meet a community need and to bring the youth program to the center of our church.

During the Ministry Review a community ministry was identified with a need for some space to continue its program of helping those in need. This ministry is the Community Closet. The Community Closet helps those who are in hard times cloth themselves and their children in a dignified way of discreetness with quarterly open sessions and private appointments in-between. Their current space in the upstairs of the old armory/rec center is not handicapped accessible. In February the church council began exploring the possibility of hosting the ministry in our building. Since that time, other plans developed for the current site of the Community Closet and they need to be out by the end of June.

Also, the Building Review and our Planning Team identified the small chapel as being an underutilized space (used for less than an hour a week) and our Youth Ministry needing space to grow. The Council voted to allow the Community Closet to move into the youth room in the basement on a one year trial basis. For virtually no cost, the small chapel will be temporarily (possible permanently) converted into a youth room that can facilitate the growing youth ministry. With the youth moving into this space it will allow for better supervision and bring the youth to the center of our church. There will be some work, some things will have to be moved and even some things removed which means some familiar things will change.

The Holy Spirit is active, working and speaking to all of us at Our Savior's asking us to implement some changes to strengthen our ministries. The Spirit asks all of us to be open and accept these changes as they help those in need and strengthen our youth ministry. Please pray and have faith that as we change we become stronger together.
