The totals ended up being over \$1500 more than last year's totals. Your donations turned out to be great treasures for others. The profits from the Treasure sale were \$3,300; Coffee and Rolls, \$350; Bake Sale, \$850. It was a great sale of Quilts also as \$800 worth of quilts was sold. Paul insists that people are justified by faith in Christ rather than by keeping the requirements of Torah. By faith, they participate in the death and resurrection of Christ and now live as God's children and heirs of God's promises. But our work is never finished...

Remembering Mother's Day last month, and looking ahead to Father's Day, let's remember all parents across the globe; especially those who live in poverty and strive to keep their family fed and secure. Much of the work Church World Service (CWS) does supports and empowers parents who have risen up against all odds to provide livelihoods for their families.

One such parent is Miriam Martinez. Miriam, who did not have an opportunity to go to school as a child is now raising her eight children in Krin Krin, one of many small villages scattered along the Coco River, which makes up the border between Nicaragua and Honduras. Struggling to find a way to provide for her family, she decided to farm land.

"I had no experience in working the land," Miriam says. While she may have started out with no experience, Miriam has become a successful farmer- thanks to a CWS supported agriculture program. Her family now has about 120 acres of land, about 75 acres of which are under cultivation with banana and plantain trees, fruit trees, tubers, beans and rice. The rest is still forested. Miriam also has chickens, pigs, cows and horses.

Because of your compassion to help those most vulnerable through the CROP Hunger Walk, Miriam now grows her family's food, and she sells extra produce to put her children through school. In addition, she is now an Agricultural leader in her community. We thank you for being a great hunger-fighter as we continue to bless parents across the globe as they gain skills and the ability to feed their families for generations to come.



From a recent letter from Anne Langdji:

The women's organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Cameroon is called Femmes pour Christ (Women for Christ). They held their general assembly in Yaounde this year, so Anne was fortunate to attend some of the sessions. The theme was around gender-based violence and it was quite controversial. The subject needs to be addressed in the church and in society, so the fact that it would result in some harsh words and statements is not unexpected.

The women dressed every day in their uniform fabric which they have produced in Cameroon. The blue and purple fabric is their regular uniform, but the yellow and green fabric was made for their 40th anniversary a couple years ago. As in worship celebrations and other gatherings in the church, the dancing and music were glorious.

In the pictures above I am with the new national director of the Women for Christ, Aissatou Nasson. On the right is Rev. Dr. Jeannette Ada Maina who is the outgoing director and the Lutheran World Federation Vice President for Africa. The group of women standing under the banner shows many of the woman pastors of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Cameroon.



A few weeks ago, I spent a sermon focusing on Psalm 23. It is perhaps the best known scripture in all of the Bible, and one that we cling to, especially in difficult times. But the power of this psalm is that it is not just meant for bad times, but speaks to our best times and all the times in between. They are words of promise, that no matter where we are on life's journey, God goes with us.

For as long as I can remember, whenever I would take a trip, whether it be a 4 hour drive or a 10 hour flight, my aunt would wish me well by saying, "Go with God." It was a helpful reminder to me that no matter where I ended up at a particular point in time, God was there with me. As we head into the summer months and we come out of our forced winter hibernations, it is time once again for our lives to become filled with travel. Families take advantage of the school break, better weather means we can head to the lake once again, and the sunshine beckons us to places near and far. As we prepare to hit the road again, it can be a helpful reminder that God goes where we go.

It's a good thing to remember, especially as the travel season kicks in once again, because the reality of busy lives means that Sunday morning worship can fall a little by the wayside as other things come up. Vacation, traveling sports, and even our beds as we catch up on lost sleep from the school year are all places God goes with us. And just because we can't make it into the sanctuary on Sunday morning doesn't mean that God doesn't go with us, it just means we have to be a little creative.

So, this summer, I invite you to find ways to "Go with God!" no matter where you are:

- Stay connected with Our Savior's on the go!
 - 1. Tune into KOVC 1490 at 11:00 a.m. on Sundays
 - 2. Follow us on Facebook and our website to see what the church is up to and watch for Sunday's sermon to be posted
 - 3. Sign up for automatic offering ("Simply Giving") so you never feel disconnected
- Find a church or worshiping community in the place you're visiting. A lot of churches have summer schedules and worship opportunities during the week. Looking online is a great start.
- Download church podcasts (maybe even Pastor Kyle's?!) or religious/spiritual books onto your phone so you can listen on your drives or on a plane
- Be intentional about praying during meals, wherever they may be. Have some fun creating a camp-side prayer or lake prayer with your family.
- Find out what the readings are in church on the week you are going to be gone and read them at home.
- Pick up a free "Christ in Our Home" devotional from the office or the information counter to take with you. You could also look in your local bookstore or online for other devotionals and prayer books to follow along with.

This is certainly not an exhaustive list of options, but it's a start. Come up with your own ideas! Adapt and combine these! Be creative! And "Go with God!" this summer,
