



This year, we join the prophets, psalmists, John the Baptist, Mary, Elizabeth, Joseph, Simeon, Anna, shepherds, angels, and the Magi in dreaming about the possible future – not just our own, but the one God envisions for this world. As we'll hear over the course of the next weeks, each of them received, discovered, and responded to God's dreams for this world in diverse and powerful ways.

My guess is that our dreams have taken the shape of wishing for a "return to normal" over the past months, and it has become more and more difficult to think about anything else. But in Advent, we are invited into the mystery and awe of God's dreams and we pray that they might shape our reality, both present and future.

Our hope is that this Advent and Christmas, different though they are sure to be from any before, is that we all might have permission to dream again – bigger and outside of ourselves – for a deeper connection with God, our neighbors, and for a better world.

This year is for those who dream of comfort and for those who have given up on their dreams. This year is for those whose dreams have been crushed and for those who have shown us that dreams take time.

Together, we will seek and sow God's dreams for our world and, hopefully, experience God's hope, peace, joy, and love along the way.

So in the immortal worlds of Aerosmith – dream on.
