Highlights from the February Congregation Council Meeting

Bishop Election: No names were submitted by the congregation for candidates for our Eastern North Dakota Synod Bishop. The pastors were authorized to submit names on behalf of the congregation. A meeting of Jamestown Conference Churches will be held on March 29 at 4:00 pm in Jamestown to determine which names will be submitted to the synod for this process. Our Savior's can send council members and representatives to this meeting.

Easter Worship: Easter morning worship will be at 8:30 and 11:00 am. Due to small attendance previous years, we will not have 7:00 am sunrise service.

Capital Campaign: The council agreed to hire Pastor Blair Anderson with New Horizons Congregational Consulting to lead our capital campaign. He comes highly recommended. Pastor Blair will coordinate 80-100 volunteers from our congregation in an effort to meet our \$600,000 goal towards building maintance and improvements. He will begin working with us soon, so that we might have a commitment Sunday in May. Opening a new Capital Campaign 2020 account was authorized for the purpose of this project.

Have you heard about...

Website, book, or podcast recommendations from one of your pastors to help you grow in your faith. This month, I want to lift up the teachings and values of our wider church, the ELCA. Last year, Our Savior's did the hard work of naming our core values. The ELCA as a whole does the same thing, not releasing one line value statements, but instead larger teaching documents known as Social Statements.

ELCA social statements are teaching and policy documents that provide broad frameworks to assist us in thinking about and discussing social issues in the context of faith and life. They are meant to help communities and individuals with moral formation, discernment and thoughtful engagement with current social issues as we participate in God's work in the world. Social statements also set policy for the ELCA and guide its advocacy and work as a publicly engaged church. They result from an extensive process of participation and deliberation and are adopted by a two-thirds vote of an ELCA churchwide assembly.

Dear church,

As we begin yet another Lenten journey, it is important to remember what it is this "journey" we are taking is all about. The idea of calling Lent a "journey" can itself like a cliché, but it is indeed a journey. Too often for us, this journey of Lent becomes only about giving something up and coming to church on Wednesdays as well as Sundays. But it is so much more than that. Lent is a time set aside specifically for us to focus on things that sometimes get lost in our day to day lives, and to walk alongside Jesus on his journey to the cross.

On Ash Wednesday we began our forty-day journey toward Easter with a day of fasting and repentance. Marking our foreheads with dust and ash, we acknowledged that we all will die and return to the earth. At the same time, the ashes placed on our heads traced the same life-giving cross marked on our foreheads at baptism.

These seemingly juxtaposed ideas of life and death bookend our Lenten journey. Just as we did at the end of February, we will again confront our mortality on Good Friday when once again death will be at the focal point of our worship. And yet, in the midst of the pain and anguish of Good Friday, we look to the life giving cross. It is the same one marked on our heads at baptism and in the own ashes that we will return too, a reminder that God is stronger than even the power of death, a truth that we anticipate celebrating on Easter Sunday.

As Pr. Emmy and I thought about the shape and focus of our time together in Lent, we couldn't help but get caught up in these themes of life and death, rebirth and renewal. And so this year, we are trying a new thing, a "Holy Experiment", and shaping our worship and reflection around these ideas and the mighty stories in the bible that proclaim that promise.

On Sundays we will hear some selections from some of the great bible stories, the one's traditionally read at the Vigil of Easter, and focus on the promises and signs made to God's ancient people, and what those promises might mean for us today.

And on Wednesday evenings, we will engage with the gospel stories that chronicle Jesus' ministry until his last days. During our worship, we will hear these stories told by many voices, and will reflect on their powerful message of renewal in song, story, and silence.

We are excited to take this journey with you. On this journey I expect that we will be challenged, and also that we will grow together, but I would have it no other way. May our 40 days be blessed, dear people, as we prepare for the heartache and the joy of the cross to come.
