November 15 Hear the parable of the talents, calling all the saints to use our gifts, which we still have time, for the greater and common good.


November 22 is Christ the King Sunday. Our worship will include a journey through the church year, as we remember the love of Jesus that holds us through all the seasons of life.



GOD'S WORK OUR HANDS

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

The need for Lutheran World Relief quilts and kits has never been greater. On August 4, 2020, three 40' shipping containers filled with humanitarian aid that included thousands of handmade quilts and baby care items were destroyed in the explosions of a ship at the port of Beirut, Lebanon. The total value of the lost shipments was approximately \$624,000. The loss of more than 22,000 quilts, sewn by individuals and members of Lutheran congregations across the U.S. could mean a bitter winter for thousands of refugees. In addition, the shipping containers held 100 cartons of kits filled with school supplies, 300 cartons of personal care kits and 125 cartons of baby care kits.

Even in these COVID-19 times when most activities have been at a standstill, members of Our Saviors

Lutheran have been meeting in small COVID-19-safe groups quilting and assembling Lutheran World Relief

Kits. In fact, a record number of personal care kits were assembled. The totals for quilts and kits sent in

2020: Personal Care, 572; Baby Care, 60; School, 180 and 65 quilts. In addition to the quilts sent to LWR, many
quilts are given locally to those in need. A huge thank you to all who helped in any way. A special thank you to
James Jensen for loaning the trailer that transported our 66 boxes to Fargo on October 15. We don't rest on our
laurels but are already thinking of 2021 shipments. Here's how you can help. We are going to feature Baby Care

Kits in November and December. Items needed for this kit:

light weight cotton t-shirts (onesies can be used) cloth diapers

long sleeve gowns or sleepers socks

diaper pins or large safety pins hand towels, dark color

bath size bars of soap, in original wrapper jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt w/hood

receiving blankets-medium weight, cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn (36" square and 52" square)

Leave your donations in the bassinet! Gently-used thrift store finds are great! Sizes 6-24 months may be used. Flannel sheets may be used to make the diapers. Hand towels and bath towels for personal care kits may be things you have extra of in your home and are always needed. We are able to order some items in bulk, so monetary donations and grant monies from Thrivent are always appreciated. Good Samaritan Quilters meet on Tuesdays and more helping hands are needed. You need not be a quilter as there is a need for other things like ironing and cutting. If knitting or crocheting is a skill you have, there are jobs for you too. If you have any questions on any of these needs or would like to volunteer, you may contact Jan Stowman, <u>840-1808</u>.

Highlights from the October Council Meeting The Council met via Zoom.

Capital Campaign/Flat Room Project: The Capital Campaign Fund has a current balance of \$54,919.82. About 2/3 of the flat roof project is complete. The project has experienced some delays. Due to a clogged roof drain, there has been some damage to ceilings and walls, with Pastor Kyle's office receiving the worst damage. Bids for those repairs are being sought.

In-Person Worship: With the County still in the Yellow Risk Level, we continue with no regular inperson worship at this time.

Sunday School & Confirmation: Regular in person Sunday Schools on hold until at least January. A drive through Bible pick up for PreK and 3rd Graders was held October 18th. Modified Confirmation and Kids for Christ activities are happening on Wednesday, with small groups and COVID procedures in place. Nine 10th grade students affirm their baptism on Sunday, October 25 at 1:00 pm. A "reception-in-abag" will be shared with each family to celebrate at home following the service.

God's Work. Our Hands. We had great participation in collecting bottled water, individually packaged snacks, and facemasks for our local schools in the "For School's Sake Project."

GLOBAL HEALTH MINISTRIES... an update

Mid October Global Health Ministries (GHM) held a virtual conference called COVID-19 Lessons & Innovations from Around the World. The 3 one hour sessions are all available to view at https://www.ghm.org/conference-2020. Here's a review of session one.

The first hour of the virtual conference featured health leaders from Madagascar, Nigeria and Tanzania, all countries where GHM is working.

Madagascar has been hit hard, losing two presidents of the Malagasy Lutheran Church to COVID. Madagascar has also seen a rise in malnutrition because when people get sick with COVID it is hard for them to raise the crops for their food. They have also seen domestic violence increase and overall, more insecurity and mental health issues.

Initially in Nigeria the people did not believe how deadly the coronovirus is, and then when they saw people dying of it, they were afraid to go to clinics/ hospitals for well-check care, such as immunizations and prenatal care, etc. All the countries stated that it has been detrimental to their economies.

These countries have established campaigns via radio and TV, but rural folks often don't have access to those mediums, so pastors are often the main communicators.

These countries have a thread bare infrastructure, a lack of water to wash hands. And how to quarantine in a 1 room house with 5 family members? There are no ventilators, no stimulus checks and no government support. The situation is dire.

The top 3 priorities for developing countries are 1) education, 2) getting ready for the next wave of COVID, 3) continuing with the partnerships that have been established like that of Global Health Ministries who continues to bring a modicum of hope to these areas.







The In-Between Time

It seems to me that we are "in-between times." We are in between the glory of fall and the heart of winter. We are in-between life before the COVID Pandemic and what life will be like when a vaccine is readily available. How are you doing in this "in-between time"? In- between times bring unique challenges, especially to those of us who like certainty. When we are in-between times, it's hard to settle in and make plans. It's easy to get anxious and short with one another. We might find ourselves a little grumpy, remembering what used to be and looking with longing about what could be to come.

When it comes down to it, being a follower of Jesus is about living in-between times. We are in-between when Jesus came and when he will come again. For centuries, the church has proclaimed, "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." As I learned in seminary, we trust that Jesus Christ is with us NOW, even though his ways are NOT YET fully among us. Faith isn't ultimately about having everything figured out; Faith is ultimately about living in hope.

In Romans, Chapter 8, the Apostle Paul encourage us to remain hopeful in this in between time:

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will ob tain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Frederick Buechner reflects on hope in Jesus:

For Christians, hope is ultimately hope in Christ. The hope that he really is what for centuries we have been claiming he is. The hope that despite the fact that sin and death still rule the world, he somehow conquered them. The hope that in him and through him all of us stand a chance of somehow conquering them too. The hope that at some unforeseeable time and in some Unimagined able way he will return with healing in his wings.

So, beloved people of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, remain steadfast in hope. Continue to cling to the promise made in baptism, that you are marked with the cross of Christ forever. Forever Jesus loves you. Forever Jesus loves the world. Live in the hope of Jesus' love.
