#### Highlights from the August Congregation Council Meeting

**Capital Campaign/Flat Room Project:** Due to the contractor running behind schedule, the roof project has been delayed. We still anticipate that it will be completed this season. As of July 31, the Capital Campaign Account was at \$40,000. The estimated cost of the project is \$105,000.00.

**Sunday School & Confirmation:** Sunday School will move forward with online registration in September. Classes or activities may start in October. Confirmation Classes will be held in small groups. Confirmation Sunday, October 25, will include a special service at 1:00 pm for Confirmation Students and Families only. The service will also be on Facebook Live.

**Community Outreach:** The Blood Drive and Outdoor Community Closet Opening were held in August. Both events were successful thanks to great volunteers. "God's Work. Our Hands." Day of Service has usually been held in September. No plans have been made for this year; however, we may see about doing modified activities in October, if particular needs arise.

Thank you, gracious God, for the gift of this coming night. Restore me with your right spirit. Calm my mind. Quiet my heart. Enfold me with your bountiful mercy. Protect me from all harm, that I sleep assured of the peace found in you alone. I ask this in the name of Jesus, who gives us rest. Amen "On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there..." – John 2:1

Saying it again seems exhausting...but this year looks nothing like what we had planned. As the weeks and months have gone on, all of us, I think, have tried our best to make parts of this all feel "normal", but of course it's not.

Forgetting for a moment the plans the church had for this year with capital campaigns and stepping faithfully into some Holy experiments, this year was set to be a full one personally. In May, we were set to join our dear friend Liz for her wedding in Lancaster, PA. About a month ago, we had planned to enjoy the beaches of Tampa for some restoration and to celebrate the wedding of my best friend (also named Kyle). And then, of course, I looked forward to Sharayah and I's wedding, set for October 24<sup>th</sup> in Chicago.

Planning to get to three out of state wedding's was hard enough, on top of planning the one that is your own. To those who have felt the stress of a wedding – I hear you, I see you, and I understand.

In the thoughtfulness around my own wedding plans, I gained some perspective I think about the wedding at Cana from John 2. With all the weight of planning a good party, I suppose nothing could be worse than running out of wine for your guests. Lucky for that happy couple, Jesus was on the invite list that particular day. But I think maybe our challenge is to see this as more than a story of Jesus snapping his fingers and making a cab-sav, but rather as an invitation to find holiness in the chaos of things.

Sometimes you run out of wine at a wedding. Sometimes vacations are

cancelled. Sometimes you have to scrap capital campaigns. In all things, regardless of if they worked out how we had planned or imagined, our faith calls us to trust that God is at work. Our story of faith is one of good news in the midst of bad situations, of hope and restoration in the midst of exile, and life even in the midst of death. For lots of us, it's taken some intentional, thoughtful work to find that promise alive in our current daily realities.

But I share with you this parable. After cancellations by friends and difficult conversations, it became clear that our wedding as we envisioned wasn't going to happen. And so, with uncertain futures and supportive families, we took the leap. Sharayah and I started the next journey in our lives together at the Lutheran Church of the Cross in West Fargo on April 1<sup>st</sup> with only 3 friends and a toddler in attendance, our families watching through a phone. And in that 20 minute service that started a bit late, with our dear friend and officiant Elizabeth Hiller crying the whole service, and our witness' toddler banging on the drum set in an empty church, there was holiness, there was peace, and there was God.

As we as a church head into another program year, we do so knowing that things will be different – and different in ways none of us have ever seen before. And yet, we know and trust that God will be there, somehow and someway. In the sadness, the stillness, and Sabbath of the road ahead, may we be thankful for those moments where God breaks through making the ordinary, extraordinary.
