#### MIDWEEK BIBLE STUDY


Meets Wednesdays at 9:30 am in the Gathering Room.



**Flat Roof Project & West Entrance:** The Property Committee is still in conversation with the roofing company about final billing, taking into account the add ons to the project and the water damage in the building during the construction time. The Committee is still working to secure a contractor who will pour concrete steps for the West Entrance.

**Pandemic Plan Restart:** The Congregation & Family Life Committee plans to call a meeting of the Servant Group Coordinators to discuss Sunday morning coffee hour & funeral lunches. At present time, both have been put on hold. As we look to the fall, the committee will ask for the coordinators input regarding best plans for moving forward.

"The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world, and if you eat of this bread, you shall live forever...you shall live forever. And I will raise you up, and I will raise you up on the last day." – "I Am the Bread of Life" ELW #485, verse 2

Once every three years, our church readings invite us to read all of John 6, an extended metaphor on Jesus as the bread of life,...for five....straight....weeks.

Like that loaf of sandwich bread that sits on top of your fridge for a few days to long, our occasional trudge through John 6 can quickly get a little stale. But, this year, we'll hope to bring a new energy to these classic gospels with the help of our friends at Barn Geese Worship.

As we walk through these this theme in worship, we'd invite you to explore them in your daily practice as well. Read John 6 a few times this month. Make some bread. Share a meal with friends. Feed 5,000 people?! Or maybe try this short meditation that you can do with whatever bread you have around your home. Maybe it makes sense to try this during your normal prayer or devotional time, or maybe before a meal in place of your table grace. Whatever works for you, give it a try. Even if it seems silly. We don't always understand Jesus. But we need him, like daily bread, every single day to sustain and satisfy us. And in prayer, meditation, and devotion, we often experience God in new and unexpected ways.

So grab a slice and settle in...and experience the good news that is the gospel according to bread.

- 1. Find a comfortable position, with your feet resting on the floor and your arms relaxed at your side. Take a few deep breaths, in and out.
- 2. First, hold the bread on your open palm. Just hold it. Notice the weight of it. Is it heavier than you thought it would be? Lighter? Touch it with your fingers and note the texture. Close your eyes. Smell the bread. Does it remind you of anything else or is it unique? Notice what effects the scent has on your body.
- 3. Now take a moment to consider all of the people involved in bringing this food to you. Farmers who grew the grain, people who harvested it, truck drivers who transported it, factory or mill workers, bakers, shelf-stockers, storekeepers there are hundreds if not thousands of people whose labor created this simple occasion of bread in your hand. Take a moment to consider them. Imagine what they look like, how hard they work to support themselves and their families.
- 4. Then widen your consideration further. Consider all the conditions necessary to create this food. What weather did it need? Sunshine or rain? What plants were involved? What threats were there to its growth—wind or drought or animals or insects?
- 5. Now, bite into the bread and chew. Try to notice every movement. Do only one thing right now. Only chew and eat. Does the flavor change? How is the texture different? Then finally, when you do swallow, see how far down you can feel that bread go.
- 6. End with a moment of silent thanks for the food you've eaten.
- 7. Finally, hear these words of promise: The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world, and if you eat of this bread, you shall live forever...and I will raise you up on the last day. Amen.
