**Memory Verse:** God has made everything beautiful in its time. Ecclesiastes 3:11

**Faith Practice Spotlight: Journaling.** This year, consider making a beauty journal. In it, you can record all of the thing you *notice*, *create*, or *appreciate* that are beautiful. Keep the journal for a whole year, and use it for reflection. There is beauty all around.

Highlights from the December Congregation Council Meeting

The Council met via Zoom.

<u>Flat Roof</u>: Most of the work is completed. The flashing and ladder remain to be completed. We are still in conversation with the roofing company about water damage inside the building during the construction process.

Farm Fund: The Council authorized \$67,000 in gifts from our farm income this year. Recipients include: Eastern North Dakota Synod, Red Willow Bible Camp, Salvation Army, Barnes County Food Pantry, Lutheran Social Services, Great Plains Food Bank, Dacotah Oyate Lutheran Church, VCPS Access for All, UND-NDSU Campus Ministries, Barnes County Transportations Services, and our local Senior Prescriptions Assistance Program.

<u>Annual Meeting</u>: The Annual Meeting will be on January 31, 2021 at 10:30am. Meeting will be both in-person and virtual, which is authorized in the Constitution. Need a total of 50 persons in attendance for quorum.

<u>Nominating Committee</u>: The Nominating Committee has begun their work in filling council and committee positions for 2021.

<u>Education</u>: The plan is to resume Sunday School beginning January 10<sup>th</sup>. Details will be worked out to follow guidelines regarding distancing and masks. Communication will be provided to families, as plans are made.

<u>Property Committee:</u> The Council approved the purchase of a new copier and authorized the redoing the wood floor in the choir practice room.

Then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed life into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being. -Genesis 2:7

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." – John 20:21-22

Breath is a powerful thing. Breath is the very essence of life itself. To breathe is to have life. The Bible reminds us that breathe comes as a gift from God. In the very beginning, God breathed life into being. In one of Jesus' first resurrection appearances to the disciples, he breathes the life-giving power of Holy Spirit upon them.

Breath is a powerful thing. The very act of paying attention to our breathing and taking even three deep breathes in and out (in and out) (in and out) can reset our body. Deep breathing causes a physical reaction in our body. It actually helps relieve the stress and tension that we carry.

Breath is a powerful thing, and I have come to see paying attention to my breathing as a form of prayer. No extra tools needed. I think about breathing in the love of God and breathing out the burdens that weigh me down. In and out. Peace and calm fill me. Worry and fear leave me.

The Gospels tell us that from time to time, Jesus would step away from the crowds to find a quiet place to rest and pray. I imagine him taking deep breaths. Breathing in the love of God. Breathing out the pain and distress that he had taken on. Perhaps, in those moments, he even prayed the prayer he'd speak just before he took his last breath: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Luke 23:46).

As we step into a new year, Pastor Kyle and I hope that in our times of worship and devotion, you might be given an opportunity to "Take a Breath." As we share familiar liturgy and hymns, as we hear beautiful stories of Jesus, and as we pray, may we remember that we our connected to the one who breathed life into our being. May we remember that Jesus continues to breathe Holy Spirit upon us, bringing forgiveness, renewal, and life.
