Updates from the December Council Meeting

Redirection of LSS Giving: With the unexpected closing of Lutheran Social Services in January of 2021, the council re-designated the \$1,000 in our budget for LSS to Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Services.

Building Project Updates:

- The Property Committee has solicited two bids for the Sanctuary Roof. There is an option to put roofing over the shingles at \$173,000 or take shingles off for \$193,000. The Property Committee will explore receiving another bid and move forward in cooperation with the Executive Team.
- Digital Boiler controls is on order.
- Security system needs and options are being explored by the property committee.
- New ceilings tiles are being secured for Gathering Room & main level bathrooms.
- There are no new bids on the west stair repair. The committee will be meeting with a local contractor to explore options.

Annual Meeting: The Annual Meeting for Our Savior's Lutheran Church has been set for Sunday, January 30, 2022 at 9:40 am in the Sanctuary.

Farm Fund: Special Farm Fund disbursement in the amount of \$80,000 were made by the council to support local and regional ministries.

Chimes Replacement Gift: A special donation designated for the sole purpose of repairing and replacing the chimes has been offered to the church. The church council agreed to receive this gift and move forward with this project.

Appreciation for Pastors: In follow up from correspondence, the council agreed that a bonus be in order for the pastors. Four days of vacation and a \$2,000 were approved for both pastors.

It's said that curiosity killed the cat, but for me curiosity and faith go hand in hand. Being curious means that you realize that you don't have everything figured out – that there is more than just what you know. Likewise, being faithful means that you realize that you don't have everything figured out – that you place your trust in what we cannot see. Curiosity is looking at this world with a sense of wonder, possibility, and openness.

In Luke 18:17, Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." One of the characteristics I love about children is their curiosity. As adults, we easily take things for granted, but children are still on a quest to figure out the whys and hows of this world. Questions abound: What happens to the water after it goes down the bathtub drain? Why do I have to wear shoes at the restaurant? Why don't the trees have leaves on them? To receive the kingdom of God as a little child is to live with such curiosity about the world around us.

Last year, at this time of year, we invited you to choose a "star" word – we even sent them to households in our congregation. Do you remember what your word was? The words were meant to inspire you, giving you purpose and direction for the year. This year, instead of star words, I'd invite you to choose one or two things that you are curious about and commit to exploring those areas. Search the internet (checking for reliable resources!), go the library and get a book or video, ask around to see if there might be an expert or someone who might know more than you about the topic. Curiosity isn't only for children. Curiosity allows us to live more deeply, to live life that really is life.

Perhaps our call (or part of our call) as church in 2022, is to walk together in our curiosity. I really would like to know what you are curious about! Please mention it to me (Pastor Emmy, did you know I'm curious about....) or drop me an email. Perhaps there are ways we can explore some of those wonderings together. We are called to rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep, and...maybe be curious with those who are curious!
