I often find that it's hard to get a sense of what is happening in the larger narrative in just the short scripture selections we hear on Sunday mornings. The Bible is such a complex web of stories, events, and relationships that there is so much more going on than meets the eye. So as we as a church centered our worship around the stories of the apostles in Acts this past Easter season, I spent some intentional time re-reading the book as a whole.

In the latter part of the book, Paul, while preaching in Athens, has the following interaction:

A group of philosophers began to debate with him. Some of them asked, "What is this babbler trying to say?" Others remarked, "He seems to be advocating foreign gods." They said this because Paul was preaching the good news about Jesus and the resurrection. ¹⁹ Then they took him and brought him to a meeting of the Areopagus, where they said to him, "May we know what this new teaching is that you are presenting? ²⁰ You are bringing some strange ideas to our ears, and we would like to know what they mean." (Acts 17:18 – 20)

Often in the scriptures we hear in church, we hear stories of disciples or opponents of Jesus who have no interest in hearing or who simply can't fully wrap their heads around God's good news of great joy. To be honest, I'm not so sure I can always wrap my head around it either. But what I appreciated so much about this interaction was the Greek philosophers' genuine curiosity and interest in learning and trying a new thing. In the end, Paul's message might not be for them, but they are willing to give this persecutor turned street preacher an opportunity to make his case.

One of my favorite new television show's to watch has been *Ted Lasso*. During an episode in the show's first season, American football coach turned English soccer coach Ted shares a memory from his early life in Kansas.

He recalls, "…one day I was driving my little boy to school and I saw a quote by Walt Whitman, it was painted on the wall and it said, 'Be curious, not judgmental.'…So I get back in my car and I'm driving to work and all of the sudden it hits me – all them fellas that used to belittle me, not a single one of them was curious. You know, they thought they had everything figured out so they judged everything and they judged everyone. And I realized that their underestimating me – who I was – had nothing to do with it. Because if they were curious they would have asked questions…"

It seems to me that we as church and God's people might still be able to learn something from centuries old Greek philosophers and sitcom soccer coaches. What if we were to follow where the Spirit might be leading this season of Pentecost? As we meet new people and new ideas on our life's journey, what if we met them with curiosity instead of judgement? What if we were willing to wrestle with new ideas and to ask questions so that we might experience God's love and peace in surprising and unexpected ways?



Notes From Your Treasurer\$\$

Our Savior's has two really neat mission support projects each year which are not a part of our general budget: You know them as the Missionary Calendar and Global Health Missions.

The Missionary Calendar supports our two missionaries, Willy and Anne Langdji, who serve in the Central African Republic (CAR). We have committed an annual support of \$6,000 which flows through Eastern ND Synod.

We also support Global Health Missions with an annual payment of \$4,000 that is usually sent directly to Global Health each December. Global Health Ministries is a volunteer powered organization of about 2100 volunteers and a staff of about 80 people. Medical equipment and supplies are shipped all over the world to support Lutheran healthcare systems. It may be as big as helping equip health facilities with x-ray machines or as simple as supplying a mission hospital with basic supplies like bandages etc.

The Missionary Calendar has 365 days, and if the days were all filled it would generate \$9,125 to be used toward these two projects. I have never seen this happen in the six years I have been your treasurer. At year end, I often have to visit Ken DeKrey for a donation from the Farm Fund to help our two commitments. I would sure love to see Our Savior's honor our missions by dedicating gifts to these projects. When we see the word "missions" on the gift giving, it is set aside for Global Health Missions. When we see "Missionary Calendar," the gifts are set aside for our missionary support. I challenge you to support our mission projects!
