Updates from August Council Meeting

Building Projects: Work has begun on the roofing project over the sanctuary. New windows for the apartments have arrived. Installation of windows and west step project is anticipated to be done yet in 2023. Bids have been accepted for carpet installation in the gathering room. An egress window was installed at the Chautauqua Parsonage. Now, drywall and new carpet is waiting to be done.

Youth Director Position: The Council accepted a proposal to hire Wendi Wilmes to assist with youth programming, including Confirmation, Senior High Lunch, and other events for the 2022-2023 academic year. Wendi serves as youth director at Faith Lutheran Church. This will be a sort of "holy experiment" to explore how joint youth ministry efforts might be possible in the community. Pastor Kyle will also be assisting with senior high lunches. There will be no Kids for Christ this year at Our Savior's.

Library Committee: There has not been an active library committee at the church for many years. A gathering is to be held on Wednesday, August 17th to discuss the library and how to move forward with remaining funds in the Library Account.

Standard Worship Times: The Council agreed that worship in September-May will resume to two worship times, now at 8:30 and 10:30 am. Sunday School will shift up time accordingly.

Senior Pastor Resignation: Pastor Emmy Swedlund has submitted her letter of resignation. Her last Sunday will be September 11th and last day of employment, using remaining vacation time, will be September 19th.

Every culture pays special attention to the children in its care. Injury and harm done to the young impacts all generations. In the past year, we have heard news about the American Indian children who were sent away to boarding schools and died there without being returned to their families. These sins are part our nation's history. Following last year's news, the American Indian Alaskan Native Lutheran Association (AIANLA) within the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) issued a letter on behalf of the Indigenous people throughout North America. In part, it says:

"In honor and memory of the children of the First Nations people and of our Native children who never made it home, and for those still living the nightmare imposed on them as children of Canada and the United States we humbly ask our brothers and sisters of the church to hang an orange banner in the sanctuaries of your churches for 225 days. In remembrance and lament of each child that was thrown into those graves, and those yet to be discovered we honor each of their lives. The color orange is symbolic and came from the inspiration of a survivor of that era, Phyllis Webstad, who stated that when she was a 6-year-old girl arriving at a residential boarding school, she was stripped of her clothes which included a new orange t-shirt her grandmother had gifted her and was never given back." Beginning in September, we at Our Savior's will hang orange banners in the back of the sanctuary for 225 days as a period of remembrance, repentance, and resolve to live in equitable partnership with neighbors of Native identity. Prior to them hanging at Our Savior's, these banners hung for 225 days at First Lutheran Church in New Rockford, and following their time at OSLC, will be passed on to another congregation in our Eastern North Dakota Synod. This is the work of being church together and loving neighbors better.

REMEMBER TO REMEMBER

Did you know...Our Savior's Lutheran Church celebrates 140 years of ministry this year! The beginnings of what was to become Our Savior's Lutheran Church can be traced as far back as 1878. The congregation was formally organized in 1882, under the Rev. Joahannes G.D. Bothne, along with forty-two members, twenty of whom were confirmed. I counted: From those early years until now, the congregation has been served by no less than 27 different pastors – only some of whose pictures appear in the "pastor gallery" in the overflow space.

Through the years, the congregation has called two different buildings home. In 1904, a white frame church building was erected. In 1939, construction of our current church building began, although the congregation didn't begin worshipping in our current sanctuary until September 25, 1948. Since then, there have been multiple building projects along the way.

Through it all, Our Savior's Lutheran Church has been a congregation that is rooted in community and in the love of Jesus Christ. There have been weddings, baptisms, confirmations, birthday celebrations, and funerals. There have been Bible studies, cantatas, Vacation Bible Schools, and committee meetings. There have been food drives, treasures sales, quilts & kits assembled, and meals eaten. I wonder how many cups of coffee and desserts have been enjoyed at Our Savior's over the years?!

To be a part of a church community is to be a part of something bigger than our selves. As Robin Wall Kimmerer says in her book *Braiding Sweetgrass*, when we participate in religious traditions, we "remember to remember." When we come to worship or gather in Christian community, we remember to remember that we are loved. We remember to remember that God so loves this world. We remember to remember that the Creator of all continues to create new life, new possibilities, and new ways in our midst.

I count myself deeply privileged to be a part of the long legacy of Our Savior's Lutheran Church. As I said in my letter of resignation, you all have shaped me to my very core. There is so much I will remember about Our Savior's Lutheran Church. From the silly to the serious, we have shared so much life together. Along the way, we have remembered to remember that Jesus is who we fear, love, and trust above all.

Thanks for trusting me to be your pastor during these past 12 years of the 140 years of Our Savior's Lutheran Church's ministry. It's been a good, good run. I am so, so grateful. As I wrap up my time as your pastor this month, I do so trusting that God has been faithful and God will continue to be faithful. Our Savior's Lutheran Church has and will continue to be held in the arms of our Savior.

Let us pray this prayer, that we have so often prayed together:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
