

Our Fall shipment of LWR Quilts and Kits was sent to Fargo in October. From there the items are taken to the shipping warehouse in Minneapolis and from there shipped to 19 countries, that are most in need, worldwide. To this great humanitarian need, OSL was able to contribute 130 Quilts, 287 School Kits, 163 Personal Care Kits, and 80 Baby Care Kits in 2023!

To this, comes a huge thank you to all of you who contributed in any way! Whether you helped make quilts on a Tuesday, shopped for items for the kits, cut and hemmed blankets or crocheted blankets for baby kits, assembled, packed, and took the shipment to Fargo or gave monetary contributions—it is all an important part of this ministry and is so appreciated. We would be remiss if we didn't thank Thrivent for their generous grant program that many OSL and Thrivent members take advantage of to buy items for kits in bulk. If you need more information on this program, you can let me know. You can see more info on Lutheran World Relief and the totals of Quilts and Kits OSL has given since 2012 on the bulletin board outside of the church office. We don't stop with the making of quilts and kits but also send dollars for the shipping of the items. A portion of the close to \$3000 raised at the Treasure Sale will be sent along with items for shipping. So thank you to all of you who contributed items and who helped in that way!

As you can see, Our Saviors has used "Our Hands" to do "Gods Work" for Lutheran World Relief!


I leave you with Psalm 37:34 "Put your hope in the Lord. Travel steadily along His path."

Meeting Highlights - October 11th, 2023


