August Newsletter – President's Corner

Pastor Kyle opened the July Council meeting with a reading from Nehemiah 1, who led a group of exiles to rebuild Jerusalem. In the first chapter, Nehemiah lays out his "policy," or the fundamental principles of his leadership, calling the people to repent and obey God's commandments, while remembering that they are rooted in a great heritage of God's promises to Israel. As many of the items on our agenda dealt with policy, this reading helped remind us of our own responsibility to live out the mission and values of OSLC as we established policies surrounding building use.


We then discussed the following items:

- New policies for baptism, weddings, and funerals, all of which clarify current practice, to help guide those new to the church. These policies will be available on the church website. This is the second "reading" for these policies, and all three were adopted.
- A building use policy draft was discussed, with the dual concerns that the building be a welcoming resource for the community while still providing for our congregational needs. A sabbatical policy for pastors was proposed. Both these policies will be placed on a future agenda for further discussion and action.
- Upcoming Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion activities were reviewed, which include the summer "Mr. Rogers" book study (July 21), an evening presentation by Pr. Robert on Christian Nationalism (August 15, 6:30 pm), and the "No Fear in Love" 5 week study series which will begin Sept. 15.
- Approved the directory subcommittee recommendation to use Instant Church Directory to develop the church directory this fall. This will provide both a print and online/mobile phone directory which can be updated to provide "just in time" information to all members.

"Introduction to Christian Nationalism" presented by: Pastor Robert Franek Thursday, August 15th + 6:30 – 7:30 p.m.

Presented by our former interim pastor, and member of the Eastern North Dakota Synod Action and Advocacy Team, Robert Franek, this presentation will explore what Christian Nationalism is by looking at various definitions and how these frameworks can help us identify how Christian Nationalism poses a threat to the gospel and our civic life together. Participants will have opportunity to discern together how and to what degree they see Christian Nationalism present in their congregations and communities.

Drawing on the work of scholars and pastors, participants will consider how to respond to this challenge in our church and civic life and leave with some starting points to continue this work in their congregations and communities.

Dear People of Our Savior's Lutheran Church,

We have undoubtedly changed as a congregation since 2017. We have seen transitions and changes in leadership and membership. We undertook and continue in a bold capital appeal. We endured pandemic. We are, and will continue to be, church *together*.

As we step into a new era at Our Savior's, your congregational leadership and I believe now is the right time to re-commit ourselves to connection and relationship. Beginning this month, those who desire to access the directory digitally can do so through the *Instant Church Directory* website or by downloading the *Instant Church Directory* app. Those who desire to submit updated information for the directory using a hard copy submission for may also do so. **Hard copy submission forms, as well as instructions for accessing and downloading the** *Instant Church Directory* **program digitally, can be found on the information counter at the church.**

In September, a more formal rollout and timeline for the directory and *Instant Church Directory* program will occur. We anticipate hard copy directories to be available sometime in November. In the meantime, we are excited to get the ball rolling on this first step in our re-connection commitment.
