And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. We wait in hope. Hope is what begins our Advent journey. Hope is what carries us through the journey. Hope is the name given to the first candle lit on the Advent wreath. I find it no mistake that Hope is lit not just once, but all the way to the coming of Christ on Christmas morning.

December 2024 Newsletter — President's Corner

Pastor Nicholas opened the Church Council meeting on November 13, 2024, with a reading from Matthew 1. As we prepare for the advent season, Matthew 1 reminds us of Joseph's story, a story of faith and trust in what must have been a very confusing situation. Unlike Mary, who has a direct encounter with an angel, Joseph has a dream, from which he must determine God's will and make life-changing decisions.

In reviewing the Treasurer's report, Council discussed the concern that we are operating at a deficit, with a lower than anticipated weekly offering this year. While we are not actually in the red (because we had savings last year from an open position), we will need to budget carefully next year to work within the lower income. Discussion regarding changes in the way we collect offering included ideas such as situating plates at the front of the church so they are available when folks go up for communion, or passing the plates as we did pre-Covid; if you have suggestions, please be sure to get in touch with me or one of our Council members.

The Council decided on one small savings — by changing the distribution of offering envelopes to bi-monthly mailings, we are quoted a savings of \$500. In addition, if we are able to remove folks from the distribution list who give exclusively online, we can save even more. We will ask those who give online to contact the church office to opt out of the envelope distribution list.

Other items discussed:

Kitchen has been cleared and we are ready to begin work New Directory has been printed; copies will be available on Sunday for pick-up

Sounds of the Season (Dec 4, 11, 18) will be live-streamed this year

Transition Team for the Interim Pastor will be made up of members of the Executive Committee. Call Committee for Pastor Kyle's replacement will be identified in January.

Members of Council volunteered to provide greeters for the next month, while we consider how best to restart this welcoming effort on Sunday mornings.

Property Manager Bobby Koepplin indicated that he is retiring, effective Dec. 31, 2024. A search committee comprising of LouVay White, Margaret Dahlberg, and Pastor Nicholas was established to begin looking for his replacement.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATES

Things have been happening to the outside of our church building late summer and early fall! If you don't regularly use the south entrance to the church, you may not have noticed the outside wooden doors were sanded and stained. The wood trim on the face of the church was also sanded and stained the same color as the doors.

The wood frames and storms on the outside wood windows were deteriorating and in need of repair, so all 31 windows were cleaned, scraped, sanded, caulked, primed and painted. The exterior wood facia was also scraped, sanded, primed and painted.

The Family Gathering exterior concrete walls were scraped, power washed and had new colored EFIS (textured coating) applied. An unneeded exterior door west of the north entrance was closed off during this process and had the same covering applied. You may have not even noticed this seldom used door!

In Spring, the facia on the 2nd story roof eves will be replaced and the upper end gable trim will be replaced or refinished.

Window well grates will be stripped, primed and painted and/or replaced.

The kitchen cabinets and appliances with exception of the dishwasher have been emptied out. Vinyl flooring will be removed soon.

Cabinets have been ordered and wall construction, wiring and plumbing changes are expected to proceed shortly.

Thanks again for your generous support of the Capital Campaign which allowed these needed repairs to be made!

My financial report is a little daunting this month, as our budget was greatly distressed with changes, mostly in the employee/payrolls.

We had allotted \$64,000 for associate pastoral staff, and with the many changes, we will be over budget in that area. We also estimated \$360,000 in income, and as of October 31, the giving amounted to about \$230,000. If the November-December income averages like the previous months, we will still be OK for the year, but will have to make significant changes for the following budget year. The Capital Campaign account looks good as does the Missionary Sponsorship account. Thank you for all the ways you support OSLC.

I just returned from a family trip to Arizona. The Littles, Mac, and Jigger were more than welcoming. They are beginning to spend more time indoors and a little less time on their excellent hunting skills; and I can spend a little less time chasing them around the table to recapture and release their little critters they bring as gifts to me.

My prayer for you this month is one I have adopted from "Christ in Our Home," and I really trust this one: "Oh, in the midst of this day may I bear witness to your refreshing grace. Help me recognize new life in moments of joy, laughter, and even sadness. In Jesus' name. Amen."
