

#### The Pastor's Page:

I am a church nerd. I have claimed this identity for as long as I can remember. In junior high and high school, I served on the altar guild and loved hanging banners, changing paraments with the days and seasons, and even washing the communion wares each week. (It was the one time I was glad to wash the dishes.) In high school I also served on the church council. We had potluck lunches for the congregation on council meeting days and I did not mind staying late on Sundays for these meetings.

In May 1999 just before my high school graduation, I participated in my first synod assembly. I was the alternate for my congregation and one of our voting members was unable to go at the last minute. I was thrilled for the opportunity. I loved the plenary sessions, Bible study presentations, and workshops. As an aspiring student of liturgy and liturgical theology it was a privilege to sit in a workshop with the Rev. Paul Nelson, then the Director of Worship for the ELCA.

Shortly after that first Rocky Mountain Synod assembly in Fort Collins, Colorado, I volunteered for a day at the Church-wide assembly in Denver that summer. Beyond my volunteer duties, helping direct people in one of the long corridors and serving as an usher at worship, I had time to browse the Augsburg Fortress store set-up in one of the big halls along with several ministry tables of our church. Just weeks before beginning college at Concordia in Moorhead, I couldn't imagine a more fun way to spend a Saturday.

I was ordained at the Northern Illinois Synod assembly on June 13, 2008. And with my undergrad studies in accounting, I thought it was especially fitting that the ELCA treasurer was the Churchwide representative that year and was a participant in that service. Not so many years later I would be serving on the Northern Illinois Synod worship committee and helping to plan those very same ordination services. I always looked forward to these services and the whole of the assembly as we did the business of the synod and shared in Bible studies and meals together. In addition to synod assemblies, I found great joy in attending several Churchwide assemblies as a visitor. Since, my youth I have always had a deep intrinsic connection for the ministry we do a church together as synod, Churchwide, and partner institutions from Augsburg Fortress to social service ministries to colleges and seminaries to global and domestic disaster response and so many more.



I am especially excited for this year's Easter North Dakota synod assembly as we are Spirit gathered under the theme CHALLENGE: Learn, Discern, Respond. This year's theme comes from our Mission Statement, "Jesus Christ calls us to live in love as we serve, equip, and CHALLENGE God's people." Together, we will explore how we can learn, discern, and respond to challenges.

One of the things our Lutheran tradition has taught me is that our love for God is made known through the love we show our neighbors especially those whose stories and life experiences are different from our own and place them on the

margins of society. For as long as I can remember I have felt *challenged* to make this love known both in my daily life and through public policy that benefits the common good of all people and the planet we share.

As church together we face many challenges yes, but more, we are commissioned with the challenge to share the love and grace, justice, and peace of Jesus with this world God loves. We are *challenged* to love every neighbor as God in Christ has loved us. As we seek to love our neighbors better, gaining understanding through stories and developing

empathy and compassion for circumstances and structural forces at work we may not be able to see, God is working through us individually and communally as church together as congregation, synod, and Churchwide expressions of this body along with all our ministry partners.



#### June Newsletter – President's Corner

The meditation for the May Council meeting was prepared by Pastor Robert, using 1 Samuel 3 as his text. The young Samuel hears God calling him in the night, and he thinks the priest Eli is calling. Pastor Robert focused our attention on Eli's behavior — as the elder and spiritual leader, he helps Samuel hear/perceive the Lord. Likewise, Eli models a spirit of openness to hear the Lord's message on the following morning. May we also show similar discernment and support to others as they grow in faith!

The Council continued its review of financial accounts. Several funds held in the general account have been moved to the Foundation; the youth accounts have also been closed and moved to the Foundation. These accounts are used sparingly (perhaps twice a year), so they can be better managed by the Foundation while the monies in each fund are still restricted for their designated use. The Council also discussed the need for an updated church directory and committed \$5000 from the Farm Fund to support several youth at the Neighborhood Church in Fargo who are seeking funding to attend the Youth Gathering this summer.

Pastor Kyle indicated that plans for Summer Diversity/Equity/Inclusion activities include Green Dot training, a congregational book read, and a new study in September. Vacation Bible School registration is at 68; Senior High lunch has ended for the year with 1551 meals served this year. Pastor Robert reported his work in outlining/analyzing the church website and thoughts about developing a pastoral care team.
