At the Church Council meeting on October 9, 2024, Pastor Nicholas opened the meeting with a discussion of Lydia (Acts 16:13-15). Paul met Lydia when he searched out a group of women who gathered for prayer on the Sabbath outside the city walls. Of this encounter, the writer of acts says, "When she and her household were baptized, she begged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come into my house, and stay." So she persuaded us." Pastor Nicholas reminded us that, like Paul, we will work with those who challenge us to try new things; a good leader is one who is open to challenges and welcomes the ideas of others.

In approving the minutes from the month of September, the Council also approved minutes from a special meeting of the council (held Sept 25), at which time the Council received Pastor Kyle's resignation and authorized the Executive Committee to search for both an office manager (to replace Brenda) and an interim pastor to help Pr. Nicholas for the year following Pr. Kyle's departure. At the October 9 meeting, the Executive Committee reported that Ann Ripplinger has been hired as the new Office Manager; she started work Monday, October 7. We are very grateful for Brenda Skramstad's 20 years of faithful service in the church office and wish her the very best.

The Executive Committee also reported that the Synod Office has proposed the name of a potential interim pastor, who the Committee interviewed on Oct. 3, and whom they highly recommend. After some discussion, the Council voted to authorize the President to tender a letter of offer, with a salary of \$60,000, for a one year interim. In further business, the Council approved a simple, in-house print publication of the church directory, bound by three staples and no cover. These will be printed the week following Nov. 3, 2024, and include only the staff pages, member photos, and contact information.

Our Saviors Lutheran is certainly doing our part in this amazing ministry. We send shipments of kits and quilts in the Spring and Fall. Yearly totals were once again awesome. Thanks to hardworking people in our congregation, 300 school kits, 81 baby kits, personal care kits, and 106 quilts were sent in 2024. The Good Samaritan Quilters work on Tuesdays and can always use more hands. They make many more quilts than are given to LWR, others are given locally. If knitting and crocheting or sewing is something you can do, baby blankets and caps and surging of flannel blankets and sleepers and t-shirts is an on-going job. Some of the items that we are always in need of are: light weight bath towels and hand towels (new or gently used, dark preferred), soap, baby sleepers, t-shirts and onesies, jackets, sweatshirts and sweaters, all up to size 2T, flannel blankets, square 36" up to 52 inches, and flannel sheets for diapers. There are baskets in the Family Gathering Room to collect your items anytime. So you see, our work is never done! Once a shipment is sent, we start collecting and working on the next one. Monetary gifts are also appreciated as Women of Our Saviors sends dollars for shipping. Grants from Thrivent have been so beneficial as members can receive a grant that can be used to purchase many items in bulk. Lutheran World Relief, LWR.org, is a wonderful website that has videos and testimonials of people who have been the recipients of our generosity.
