Your faith has made you well - Matthew, chapter 9, in several places

What is faith? How does it form? What does it look like? These are questions we should ask ourselves both as individuals and as communities of faith not just once, but continually, and often. Faith is what leads us. It is what drives us towards Jesus, and towards one another as children of God. Faith is what connects us to the mysterious redeeming work of God found only in Christ.

Throughout many of the healing stories of Jesus, it is faith that Jesus says is what makes the recipient well. It is not some grand gesture or some perfect humble act of kindness that does it. It is not even who they are that matters, as Jesus proclaims this to many who would otherwise be considered outsiders by self-righteous human standards. Even one hung on a cross next to Jesus, one who arguably deserves his punishment, is given these words of promise from Jesus: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

Our faith is not stagnant either. It can and should grow and change and mature as we continue to experience life and learn about God and what it means for us to love one another. In confirmation, we often think that it is the job of the student to learn and to memorize, so that by the time they are confirmed in front of the congregation, their faith is fully formed and they have all the answers. This could not be further from the truth. If anything, confirmation exists as a starting point to faith. In confirmation, it is my hope not that the students have all the answers, but that they learn how to ask questions. Not only that, but they learn that church and their worshipping community is a safe place to ask questions, as we all should. At the end of this month, we celebrate Reformation Sunday, a day when we celebrate that Martin Luther asked questions. He acknowledged that the Church did not have all the answers, and that faith is a continually growing and changing relationship with God, not only for himself, but for the whole body of Christ throughout time.

God also has faith. God's faith can be clearly seen throughout all stories of the Bible, in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. God's faith is seen in God's continual insistence of love towards creation and towards us, the ones created in the image of God. God's faith is most clearly seen in Christ. Christ's teachings point us toward how we are to be a reflection of God's love toward one another and toward all of God's creation. Christ's death on the cross, the act of love that frees us from our bondage to sin and death, is the greatest example of God's faith. And Christ's resurrection shows us that nothing, not even death, can slow God's insistent love towards us. Go now, your faith has made you well.

At the Sept. 11, 2024 meeting of the Church Council, Pastor Kyle began our meeting with a reading from Philemon, verses 1-7. In this passage, St. Paul express gratitude for the leadership of members of the congregation, reminding us that supporting one another is a core part of our faith.

The Property Committee reported that we are ready to sign contracts for work on the facia and kitchen, and the Council approved a total expenditure of \$310,000 to complete these projects. We have only a few items left to complete the projects outlined by the Capital Campaign. The Council approved new policies related to building use, receptions, funerals, and sabbaticals; these will be posted on the Church website so they are readily available for those wishing to use the church building for various events.

Pr. Nicholas reported on the though-provoking Christian Nationalism presentation last August, with 35 individuals attending; Pr. Kyle reminded us of the adult study, "Fear of the Other: No Fear in Love," which runs Sept 15-Oct. 13 (Sundays at 10:00). The Worship and Music Committee indicated that Katie Sather will represent them at Council (following the resignation of Karen Kringlie), the Education Committee indicated that Rachel Belgard will represent them at Council (following the resignation of Diane Hochhalter), and the Congregational Life Committee noted that we will again have two "Honey Sundays" in October (Oct. 6 and 13).

Individuals can complete the Vaccination Administration Record (VAR) ahead of time. CCHD Nursing Staff will also bring copies. Vaccine Information Sheets are also available to provide more information about the benefits of the Influenza (Flu) vaccine.
