

God is not a grand puppet master or some cosmic micro-manager of each individual little thing that goes on in the world. Rather, God faithfulness towards us and creation inspires us who believe to move and speak in ways that are in alignment with our faithful in God and what we believe to be God's redemptive and restorative work in the world. It is God's work done through us. When we pray, we are continually asking to be reminded and to be reinstated into the work that God calls us towards among and for the world.

Let us pray,

Good and gracious God, we give you thanks for this day. We give you thanks for this community of faith within and beyond Valley City. Help us to be centered in you always. Teach us to love as you love. In all that we do, may it be to the benefit of all that is yours. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen





### **Property Committee News**

With a large church, two apartments, and two parsonages, there seem to be weekly needs somewhere! The fascia on the west and north sides of the church which were in poor shape are being replaced. This is a continuation of the project that was started last fall and is part of the Capital Campaign project. It is looking very nice! There is still painting to be done on the west side trim that will commence shortly. Work has resumed on the youth room with the flooring and cupboards in the kitchenette installed, giving us a glimpse of what this space will look like when completed. There is still a beam to install

in the ceiling before other work begins. The storm split a tree on the boulevard on the west side of the church and blew the top off the new tree that was planted last summer after construction work. Thanks to Tony Zarbono (the lift and chain saw man), Bill Poukka and Paul Dahlberg for getting the tree down and hauled away in just a few hours. Tony's boys helped pick up branches and got a lift ride as a reward after everything was cleaned up! The storm also blew the rooftop A/C and heater unit for the Gathering Room off its raised mount. The gas line was damaged along with some other rooftop issues but everything is back to it's original condition now. One of the parsonages is waiting on professionals to remove a damaged tree. Many thanks to Paul Dahlberg, president of the Property Committee, who is the point person when leaks appear, windstorms cause mayhem, or anything else in our buildings has needs. The grates on the outside basement windows all had to be replaced or refurbished. When Bobby Koepplin picked them up in Jamestown, he was told there was no charge. So MANY THANKS to whoever paid for this \$2,000 project for OSLC!

Greetings from your appreciative treasurer!

August! Just the word makes me think the end of summer is near. As promised, your church council reviewed the first six months of our budget planning/expenditures etc. We are maintaining our budget in most areas. I was worried about our utility billing after the June storm that affected our roof-mounted air conditioner and the MDU gas leak. In visiting with MDU, we find that it was not a financial disaster at all! Thank you for the many ways you

support Our Savior's, both financially and physically.

I decided to start cleaning out my home of 45 years of collecting things and stashing things away for when I retired or just thinking that I might use something someday or wear something that got placed in a closet and forgotten. Perhaps some of you can relate to my situation. It was daunting when I took every item out of my clothes closet. I knew I wasn't going to get to bed that night until every last piece of clothing and accessories were checked over. My car was filled twice with items to be given away. While I still have a few drawers to visit, I decided to move on to my office. I have four 4-drawer files that are holding treasures and memories.

I also started to think about cleaning out "my time." I made a list of all the things I have been doing, and started scratching things off this list that I had been doing from habit, not because I needed to do them or enjoyed them. Life is starting to feel less complicated and more thankful!

The Congregational Council met on July 9, 2025. As you may recall, last January when we approved the budget for 2025, we agreed that the Council would review the budget progress in July and provide a report to the congregation, along with any recommendations that seemed appropriate.

We appreciate the efforts of the congregation to support the proposed 2025 budget. As of June 30, we have spent \$184,229.67 from the General Fund, which is pretty much on target (50.2% of the proposed budget). During this same period we have received \$183,088.54 for the General Fund. So financially we're doing OK, thanks to your support!

On July 9, council members completed a visioning activity to help us understand where our budget and our aspirations for OSLC may not line up. Council determined that

- Our current budget does not adequately allow for community outreach, committee activities, and efforts to build community within the church.
- Our mission outreach is too heavily dependent on the Farm Fund, which is currently funding 100% of the mission \$\$ formerly included in the General Budget.
- The Building Maintenance fund requires additional funding, as we are currently spending part of the reserve in that fund.

You may recall that we committed 74% of our 2025 budget to support a staff of 2 full time pastors and 5 part time lay people (music, custodian, office support). In order to better fund our various areas of service and make certain we have funds for unexpected maintenance issues, the Council unanimously agreed that we need to reconsider our staffing model.

At our August meeting, we will review various staffing models, based on advice from the Synod, the experience of our pastors, and the ideas/concerns of our members. The Council will then formulate a recommendation to the Congregation, for discussion and a possible vote at a Congregational Meeting in September.

This is a significant conversation and potential change for our church. Please pray for our congregation and council, so we engage in Spirit--informed conversation and make a decision that will best support the work of Christ through OSLC. If you have ideas, concerns, or thoughts you'd like to share, please contact one of the Council members, or give me a call at 701-840-1206, preferably before August 13 (the next Council meeting).

### Did You Know???

The first mention of a Radio Broadcast at OSLC is in the 1933 Pastor's annual report, where he indicates that the church is supporting both a radio broadcast of OSLC services and also the broadcast of the services in Norwegian from a church in Kathryn.

When KOVC began broadcasting in 1936, OSLC began regular support for weekly broadcasts, as indicated in the 1936 annual report that shows receipt of donations/payments for this purpose. This means we have a 92-year history of supporting radio broadcasts of OSLC services!

Currently we have 22 "unsponsored" weekly broadcasts for 2025. Please help us keep this ministry alive with your donation of \$100 to sponsor a service.
