
Thank you for allowing me to be a part of your lives. May the peace of Christ fill your hearts this Christmas and always.

The Pastors and the Congregation Council have decided that there will be NO Inperson Christmas Day worship at OSLC this year. Come and Worship the New Born King!






A BIG thank you to all who contributed baked items, treasures, rolled lefse and contributed in so many ways to the Lefse,


Baked Goods, Treasure and Quilt Sale this past

The General Fund 2025 balance will change after end of month bills and payroll for November are completed.

Notes from the November 12, 2025, Council Meeting

- 1) Pr. Jared outlined the communication plan regarding the time/talent and commitment cards later this month. By this time, you should have received several letters regarding this effort, and I hope you have responded! As we begin to plan the 2026 budget, it will be very helpful to have an estimate of expected giving for the upcoming year.
- 2) Further discussion on changing communion procedures: Pr. Jared suggested we consider using both cups and intinction for awhile. He will look into possible options.
- 3) The choir members will meet later this month to discuss options moving forward. If you are interested in participating, please contact Pr. Jared or a choir member.
- 4) The property committee brought forward a recommendation to sell the Chautauqua parsonage. The Council voted to call a special congregational meeting on Dec. 7, 2025, to determine whether or not to move forward with this plan. The rationale for selling includes the following:
 - a) Last September we voted to have only one pastor (starting Jan 1, 2026). We therefore do not need two parsonages.
 - b) Cost of upkeep on an empty parsonage, including lawn care, snow removal, utilities, insurance, and regular inspections to make certain all is well.
 - c) Cost of rental vs. Income: We would have to pay property taxes and continue to maintain the parsonage. Someone would need to act as property manager to ensure the property is rented and remains in good condition.
- 5) Christmas Eve services will be at 3 pm (family service with candlelight) and 5 pm (traditional service with candlelight and communion). Both services will be streamed via Facebook. There will not be a Christmas Day service.
- 6) As the Youth room remodel nears completion, the Property Committee removed the organ located at the back of this space. It is currently in the SE corner of the overflow room. Council approved donating the organ if an interested party can be found.
- 7) The Council noted these events in the life of the congregation:

 - **b) New Members (through confirmation):** Sara Beierle, Jacob Fritchie, Parker Roelfsema, Thomas Schlotman, Zane Wurzer, Chase Coghland
