

Greetings all,

We will soon be in the church season of Lent. Our Wednesday evening Lent worships will focus on messages of some prophets of the Old Testament/Hebrew Bible. We will hear from pastors of Our Savior's, Faith, and Trinity Lutheran churches here in Valley City on a rotating schedule each Wednesday evening. Come, join in, connect with God and one another.

I offer some insight about the season. Lent, a word which comes from an Old English word meaning "to lengthen", is the church calendar season of 40 days, not including Sundays, which during worship, we prepare to again hear of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

We begin Lent on Ash Wednesday. During Ash Wednesday worship, ashes are placed on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. Ashes are a sign of repentance, remorse, and confession. We admit we have sinned; we symbolically present ourselves before God to ask God's forgiveness. In some cultures of the past ashes were also a sign of cleansing when they were mixed with olive oil. When the ashes are traced onto our foreheads, we hear the words, "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." These words remind us of our mortality: we are not invincible; our lives are about more than accumulating, security, and power. Even more deeply, we are reminded that we matter to God if we ever feel overlooked by others. And we are part of something bigger than ourselves: the message of love, grace, truth, and mercy of God through Jesus lived into God's world for all to hear and experience.

Lent has 40 days. Sundays aren't counted in the 40 days, as the church understands each Sunday to be "a little Easter." Forty is a symbolic number in the Christian tradition: there were 40 days and nights of pouring rain when Noah, family, and animals were in the ark. The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years following their freeing from Egypt (the Exodus), by the LORD their God. Jesus was in the desert for 40 days, praying, and was tested by the devil before Jesus began his ministry. During Lent, we are able to acknowledge the strains and difficulties of life.

The color of the season is purple: we are reminded of the purple robe Jesus was mockingly clothed with when he was scourged by Pilate's soldiers the day of his crucifixion. Purple is also a color of royalty and reminds us Jesus is not a political earthly king, and he is the king of heaven and earth.

This is but a portion of what Lent is and can be for us. Join together at Our Savior's as together we worship God, study, and enjoy community. May we all may come to know more of God and ourselves these weeks of Lent.

The Service and Sharing Committee is excited to share a variety of activities throughout the Lent season. Proceeds raised from these events will offset the cost of food insecurity in Valley City, primarily through paying off school lunch debts. Our goal as a congregation is to raise \$3,000 over the course of the Lent season, or \$500 per week.

- · Noisy Offering Coin War: Starting on Ash Wednesday and continuing every Sunday and Wednesday throughout Lent, we will have a "Noisy" Offering Coin War during the service. Bring not only your loose change, but also your bills! Pastor Nicholas and Pastor Rich will each have a bucket in which to collect your coins and bills. Coins will produce a "positive" total for that person and bills will produce a "negative" total. Whoever has the higher total at the end of Lent will get to put a whipped cream pie in the other pastor's face! Remember, every cent makes an impact!
- · Lent Meals: Also starting on Ash Wednesday is the pre-service Lent meals that will take place on Wednesdays at 5:30 PM. As the kitchen is not yet complete, the gathering room will be used and groups should plan to make simple meals with disposable dishes. If you're interested in preparing and serving a Lent meal, please talk to Margaret Dahlberg or contact the church office.
- · Pie Making / Bake Sale: On Saturday, March 15th, grab a bag of frozen cherries or blueberries (from the church) and bake a pie-or your favorite dessert-to be sold after the service on Sunday, March 16th. The Our Savior's kitchen may be ready by this date and if so, can be used for pie making stay tuned for more details!
- · Bible Study: Pastor Rich will host an ELCA Lenten Study, starting the Sunday after Ash Wednesday and running for five weeks. It will be held in the Conference Room following service and includes information about ELCA World Hunger at work in the world.
- · Lent Activity Calendar: Pick up a paper calendar to help you keep track of all of the activities available to participate in throughout Lent! Calendars will come out every two weeks throughout the Lent season and will be placed on the information counter by the missionary sponsorship calendar.

Notes from your Treasurer\$\$



Greetings to all of you! I'm sure that we are all looking forward to warmer weather.

On December 31, 2024 OSLC had \$97,000 in our General Account. The General Account takes care of all the regular expenditures of general supplies, utilities, payroll etc. At OSLC's annual meeting you approved a new budget that totaled \$368,000 for expenditures and \$300,000 in income. The Executive Committee worked hard on this budget, trimming whatever we felt we could. Breaking this down a little more, our expenditures should be approximately \$31,000 per month. We had expenditures of almost \$\$45,000 in January. Those expenditures included our annual property insurance payment of \$15,000 and the Otis Ele-

vator annual maintenance payment of \$1,022. OSLC's income in January was \$17,000.

Thank you for all the ways that your support Our Savior's. It is my prayerful hope that since we are on the last two major items for the Capital Campaign, we will all support our General Account generously.

The other ways I see you supporting Our Savior's is with your hands and hearts. Almost every time I enter the church building, I find people working on projects: God's work, our hands. It warms my heart and I am sure that God is smiling down on all of you! Whatever your talents are, we have room for you.

Now, on the home front: Jigger is starting to feel his age for a dog and is completely happy sleeping a good share of his day. MacArthur and Snoopy make enough noise as they chase each other up and down steps. (Too cold to be outside.) They are very respectful when the Orange Streak makes his nightly visits to clean out the food dishes. Church Council met on February 12. After welcoming several new council members, the council reviewed the treasurer's report for January. Income for the month of January was \$17,312, which is \$5,000 less than last January. Given our anticipated offering income of \$300,000 for the 2025 budget year, we need \$25,000 each month to achieve this goal.

Property Committee reports that the floor in the kitchen and small dining room is complete and most of the cabinets are installed. Service and Sharing Committee noted their preparations for the upcoming Lenten Season, which will focus on world hunger and, more particularly, on food insecurity at the local level. Worship and Music Committee indicated that they are planning to explore the addition of contemporary worship elements in our Sunday service. Each committee was charged with setting a goal for the upcoming year – an activity that is not currently in their regular duties but fits within their "mission" and will increase congregational engagement. We'll report on these goals next month!

The Council appointed the **Call Committee for Lead Pastor**, to include Cadence Fetsch, Jason Manlove, Judy Karch, Brooke Gubrud, Mindy Tvedt, Matt Jorissen, Dave Carlsrud, Pat Edinger, Tara Anderson, Audrey Pouka, and Kevin White. They also appointed Leslie Rohde to the Worship and Music committee (at her request) and Tara Anderson as the council liaison to the Foundation Board.

After discussion regarding Our Savior's mission within the community, the Council directed Pr. Nicholas to form a task force to explore the Sanctuary Church movement to determine what makes sense for our congregation.
